

Interrogatory 2nd. As No. 5, in Schedule D. Did attend the polls on said day, I saw the ballots read, tallied and counted, they were carefully and correctly read by the judges, they were correctly tallied and counted by the clerks, to the best of my knowledge and belief, and do not think it could have been done more correctly, was looking over the reading and tallying at the request of one of judges, one of the judges took the ticket from the box and opened it and passed it to the other judge, who read the ticket carefully, and then passed it to the 3d judge, who strung it, some of the tickets were strung by M. Sherry, at the request of the judge; I am a Radical, and voted for Dr. C. H. Ohr.

*Cross-examination of J. J. Hoblitzell by A. Spates.*

Interrogatory 1st. Did you or not keep a tally of the ballots as counted out by the Judges of Election?

Answer. I did not keep a tally.

Interrogatory 2d. Were the tickets counted out that night, and state, if you know, what was done with them, and was Michael Sherry one of the Judges of Election?

Answer. The tickets were counted out that night, but I do not know what was done with them; Mr. Sherry was not one of the Judges of Election, but I saw him stringing the tickets during a portion of the time.

MICHAEL SHERRY, (Sworn.)

Interrogatory 1st. As No. 1, in Schedule D. My age, 53; occupation, Justice of the Peace, residence Frostburg, Allegany county, Maryland, and have resided there 30 years.

Interrogatory 2d. As in Schedule D. He answers and says:

Answer. I did attend the election on said day I saw the ballots read, tallied and counted, as far as I could see, they used a great deal of care in counting and tallying, the names were separately read, tallied and counted, one judge took the ballot from the box and opened it, and passed it to the second, who read it, and then passed it to the third, who strung the same, except for a portion of the time when, at the request of one of the judges; I strung a portion of the tickets, I belong to the Radical party, and voted for Dr. C. H. Ohr, for State Senator; and I think that they were correctly read and tallied.
