Interrogatory 1st. What is your name, age, occupation residence, and time of such residence?

Interrogatory 2d. Did you receive the appointment as judge of election for said District in 1866; did you qualify and act as such on the 6th day of November, 1866; did the judges of said election make public a declaration that all persons registered in 1866, would by them be required to take the "oath of voters," as prescribed in Article 1st section 4th of the Constitution of Maryland; if so, for what reason, and did the said judges of election have armed men stationed at the doors or windows of the place where the polls were held or authorize them to be so stationed; if so, for what reason?

Interrogatory 3d. Did you as judges of said election, refuse or reject the ballot tendered by any person whose name appeared on the list of qualified voters, unconditionally and peremptorily and without requiring them to take any oath; if so, whom and for what reason?

Interrogatory 4th. Did you see or hear any violence intimidation or threats, used by any person or persons to deter or intimidate persons from offering to vote; if so who used the intimidation and who was so prevented, and to what political party do they belong; was the election on the 6th of November last, as quiet and orderly as usual at your said polls?

Interrogatory 5th. Is it not customary for the people of your District to carry their guns with them to public gatherings, more particularly at that season of the year, and was there an unusual display of guns at your polls; if so, state the reasons fully and whether the armed men belonged to one or both political parties, as also their names?

Interrogatory 6th. Did you hear any discharge of fire arms on the day of said election near the polls; if so, under what circumstances, in what manner and by whom?
