

with the witnesses against them, and record said testimony in the registry book, with rebutting evidence, if any was furnished, and were such witnesses summoned to appear then?

Answer. We gave the notice as required by law. We did not give them personally a notice. The witnesses were present and they were sworn, and had been summoned. Against Henry Hamill was Silas Fitzwater, Samuel Friend and Abraham Hershburger. Henry Hamill did not appear at any time; did not leave a notice upon him to appear; he did not apply to me for registration; we did not administer to him the constitutional oath, because he did not appear before us. Against Randolph Beckman the witness was Benjamin Davis; he was not there when the testimony was given in by Davis; he came afterwards and the testimony was read over to him, and he acknowledged that it was right. He did not vote at the election held on the 6th of November, 1866; he did not offer to vote. Against Alexander Farall there appeared no witnesses; he refused to take the oath, and said he would not take it. He was entered in the 7th column as disqualified.

Cross interrogatory 2d. Was the entry for disqualification against Mr. Farall made in accordance with the Constitution and Registry Law, you having stated in the examination in chief that you had read both?

Answer. I aimed to so enter it, to the best of my judgment.

Interrog. 3d. Did Mr. Farall vote in 1866?

Answer. I think he did not; he refused to take the oath.

Interrog. 4th. Did you or not first refuse his vote, before requiring him to take the oath?

Answer. Mr. Kitzmiller said, Mr. Farall, your vote is challenged; you must come in and take the oath.

Interrog. 5. Was that remark made at the time he offered his vote?

Answer. It was made at the time he presented his vote.

Interrog. 7th. What answer did Mr. Farall make to the declaration of Mr. Kitzmiller?

I don't recollect his exact words, but gave us to understand that he would not take the oath.

Interrog. 8th. What oath did you offer him.

Answer. The Constitutional oath.

Interrog. 9. Did William Reinhardt vote, or offer to vote, November 6th, 1866?

Answer. He did not.

Interrog. 10th. Did Patrick Hamill vote or offer to vote?

Answer. He did not vote, but offered to vote; his vote was rejected; he refused to take the oath when he tendered his vote; he afterward took the oath in the evening, but did not then offer his vote, and refused to answer any questions. Mr. Hamill did not appear before us in 1865 to register; the entry, I think, made against him was generally disloyal; there was
