

repeal the fourth, seventh, fifteenth, sixteenth and twentieth sections of the fourth Article of the Public Local Laws, of the city of Baltimore, relative to the qualifications of electors in said city, and regulating the time for holding elections for Mayor and members of the City Council, and the terms of, and the times for entering upon the duties of said offices, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

Which was read the first time.

The Senate took up for consideration, the bill entitled an Act, to incorporate the Andrew Small Academy, of Darnestown, Montgomery county, Maryland;

Mr. Young, submitted the following amendment:

Add additional section,

"Section 8. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which was read and adopted.

The bill was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading,
