

The question being on the first branch of the proposition, relating to the printing of the Governor's Message;

It was decided in the affirmative.

The question recurring upon the second branch, in relation to printing fifteen thousand copies of the accompanying documents;

It was decided in the negative.

Mr. Boswell submitted the following amendment:

Ordered, That 10,000 copies of the Report of the Superintendent of Public Schools be printed in the English Language, and 5,000 copies in the German Language; and 10,000 copies of the proceedings of the investigation and removals of the Commissioners of Police of the city of Baltimore be printed in the English Language, and 5,000 copies in the German Language, to be translated by Frederick Raine of Baltimore, for the use of the Members of this House;

Which was rejected.

The question recurring upon the amendment of Mr. Knott, to strike out the words, "accompanying documents;"

It was decided in the affirmative.

The order as amended was then adopted.
