

The bill entitled, An act to authorize the School Commissioners of Calvert county to sell certain bank stock held by them for the benefit of the Public Schools of said county; and to apply the proceeds to educational purposes in said county;

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Carmichael, from the Committee on the Judiciary, (the rules being suspended,) reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to provide for the speedy hearing by the Court of Appeals of the case of the School Commissioners of Baltimore city *versus* the State Board of Education;

Which was read the first time.
