Which was read and referred to Messrs. Beck, Neale and Lindsey.

Mr. Ford presented a memorial from the President and Directors of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, regarding proposed modification in the charter of the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad Company.

Mr. Ford moved to refer said petition to Committee on Corporations.

Mr. Calvert moved to strike out the word "Corporations," and insert "Internal Improvements."

Decided in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael 500 copies of the memorial was ordered to be printed.
