Was taken up for consideration on its third reading.

Mr. Knott moved to reconsider the vote by which the bill was passed to a third reading;

Insert the following additional section:

Sec. 2. And be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, That the first election of Senator to represent this State, in the Senate of the United States, which shall be held after the first day of April, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, the person elected shall be an inhabitant of the Eastern Shore, of this State; and one of the Senators to be thereafter elected, shall always be an inhabitant of the Eastern Shore, and the other of the Western Shore of this State;

The question being on the adoption of the amendment;
