The hour of 12 o'clock having arrived, in compliance with the adjournment yesterday, and in conformity with the Act of Congress, chapter 245, entitled, an Act to regulate the time and manner of holding elections for Senators in Congress, the Senators of Maryland appeared in the hall of the House, and the two bodies conjointly proceeded to hold an election for Senator to succeed the Hon. John A. J. Creswell, in the Congress of the United States.
