

So it appeared that no person received a majority of all the votes cast for Senator of the United States.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The joint assembly then adjourned to meet to-morrow at 12 o'clock, M.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

(The rules being suspended,)

Leave was granted the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill repealing sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8, of Article 25 of the Code of Public General Laws entitled "Coroners," and to enact a substitute therefor.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Leave was granted the Somerset delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Somerset county, to build a bridge over King's Creek, in said county, between the farms now belonging to Theodore W. Baker, in connection with a public road through said farms.

The bill entitled, an Act to provide for calling a convention to frame a New Constitution, and form of government for the State of Maryland;

The question being on the adoption of the amendment submitted by Mr. Linthicum to the amendment submitted by Mr. Knott.

Pending the consideration of which,

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning 11 o'clock.
