Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

His Excellency, Thomas Swann, having been duly elected a Senator of the United State for six years from the 4th of March, 1867, when the term of the Hon. J. A. J. Creswell will expire, we propose with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of
