Leave was granted the Committee on Corporations to report a bill supplemental to an Act entitled, an Act to incorporate Spruce Hill Coal Company.

Also, leave for the Committee on Corporations to report a bill to incorporate the beneficial society of the Laboring Sons

of Frederick city.

Also, leave was granted the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled, a supplement to an Act to incorpo. rate the Peabody Institute of the city of Baltimore, passed on the 9th day of March, 1858, chapter 209.

Also, leave was ganted a Select Committee to introduce a bill to enable the institution for the instruction of the blind to complete and render fit for occupation, the building now in course of erection in Baltimore county.
