and thereupon to proceed to hold said term or terms in the same manner and with the same effect as if the said term or terms had been held on the days now fixed by law, and the Grand and Petit juries so to be selected and summened, shall be taken to all intents and purposes, to be the proper and lawful Grand and Petit juries, as fully as if the same had been selected and summoned prior to the regular day of holding the term or terms of said courts."

Which was adopted.

The bill as amended was then read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Davis, of Baltimore city,

The House adjourned until to-morrow at 12 o'clock, M.
