Mr. Carmichael, chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably without amendments, the Senate bill entitled, an Act, to repeal an Act passed at the January Session of the General Assembly, in the year 1867, entitled, an Act to repeal the 4, 7, 15, 16, and 20 sections of the 4th Article of the Public Local Laws of the city of Baltimore, relative to the qualification of Electors in said city and regulating the time for holding Elections for Mayor and Members of the City Council. and the terms of, and the time for entering upon the duties of said officers, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

Which was read a second time.

Mr. Jones moved a suspension of the rules, to order the bill to a third reading;

Which was decided in the negative.

Also, the Senate bill entitled, an Act to repeal the Act of 1862, chapter 106, and sections 194, to two hundred inclusive of the 30th Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the sentence of negroes;
