Mr. Jones, from the Committee on the Judiciary, (the rules being yet further suspended,) reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section six of Article 35 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the attendance of Judges of Elections, and section 9 of said Article prescribing the oath of Judges of Elections, and section twelve of said Article prescribing notice of elections to be given by the Sheriffs of the several counties. and to enact a substitute for each of said sections;
