The bill entitled, an Act to repeal chapter 13, passed March 18th, 1865, entitled, an Act to repeal the 9th section of Article 38 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to fees of officers and to enact a substitute therefor;

Reported unfavorably from Committee on the Judiciary.

Being upon its second reading;

On motion of Mr. Knott,

The enacting clause was stricken out.

Mr. Thomas, (the rules being suspended,)

Reported favorably from Select Committee, a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 39, Article 20 of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled, Talbot county, and to re-enact the same,
