It was lost.

Mr. Stevens proposed the following amendment:

After the word "county," insert "or Baltimore City;"

Which was lost.

The question then recurring upon the bill;

Mr. Neilson moved to strike out the enacting clause, Which was lost.

Mr. Burche proposed the following amendment:

After the words "spirituous liquors," insert the words "in quantities not less than a pint;"

Which was rejected by yeas and nays as follow:
