Ordered, That the President of the Senate be requested to appoint a Select Committee of three to examine and report whether any, and if any, what, unfinished business was referred by the last to the present General Assembly ;

The President appointed Messrs. Bowie, Maddox and Philpot, as said committee.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following Joint Resolutions :

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That in their judgment, the policy heretofore announced, and up to this time consistently pursued by the President of the United States, upon the question of the right of the excluded Southern States to their Constitutional Representation in Congress, is just, wise and statesmanlike, and is the only mode by which the Union, as created and recognized by the Constitution, can be restored ;

*Resolved,* That the General Assembly recognizes in the action of his Excellency, Thomas Swann, in support of this policy of the President of the United States, and in the just and liberal execution by him of the existing Registry Law of
