Besides a large amount of money for gas pipes and fixtures, grading, which will be most expensive, as the building is ten feet above the paving line, and has one half of four streets to grade, paving, stone walls to support banks not cut away, lightning rods, and many extra expenses always incidental to the completion of a building. When to these is added the cost of furniture, it must be acknowledged that the amount required for the whole cost, \$150,000, is rather an under than an over estimate.

The total amount of State appropriation to this building is \$50,000. A further appropriation of \$30,000 will make the subscription of the State about one half of the whole cost.

The work is not only ornamental and useful but very creditable in every way to the State, and it is one the cost of which, in many States, would be defrayed entirely from public funds.

Your Committee recommend the appropriation by the State of thirty thousand dollars for this most needy public building.
