Which was read and referred to the Select Committee on Sunday Law.

Mr. Knott presented the memorial of Wm. J. Albert, Wm. Kennedy, Benj. Deford, Henry Tyson, Chauncy Brooks, Kirkland, Chase & Co., Richard Fisher, John E. Proud, Isaac McKim, Cushing & Bailey, Woodward & Baldwin and 150 other business firms and citizens of Baltimore, praying for a repeal of the proviso to section 4 of article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, limiting the exemption of taxation on the property of incorporated literary and charitable institutions of the State.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Also, the memorial of John R. Dischman and two hundred other citizens of Baltimore, in favor of a modification of the existing Sunday Law;

Mr. Hooper presented the petition of Joseph O'Keefe and one hundred other citizens of the 8th ward, of Baltimore city, in favor of a modification and change in the existing Sunday Law;
