Mr. Magruder proposed the following amendment.

In line 3 of section 2, after the word "and" insert the words "due notice of said;"

Which was adoptd.

Mr. Knott proposed the following amendment:

Strike out all after the word "shall" in 4th line of 2nd section to the word "and" in 6th line of same section, and insert "vote on the question of running the cars on Sunday by expression in writing, or printed, the words, 'For running the cars on Sunday,' or 'Against running the cars on Sunday,' as the case may be;"
