by empowering the said company to increase its capital stock or to make calls or assessments upon the present capital stock.

Also, a bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Baltimore Soapstone Company.

Mr. Thomas Chairman Committee on Ways and Means reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 2 of Article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws, title Licenses, and re-enact the same with amendments;

Also, unfavorably a bill entitled, an Act to provide compensation for the Lieutenant Governor when not acting as President of the Senate;

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Bixler, Chairman Committee on Education, reported a bill entitled, an Act to authorize the payment of back funds to Abington Academy;
