slaves and also to repeal sections 42 and 43 of Article 67 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "negroes," and subtitle "free negroes and manumission."

Also, the Senate bill entitled, an Act to make valid certain bequests under the will of Eleanor G. Scott, late of Baltimore city, deceased.

Also, the Senate bill entitled, an Act to appropriate a sum of money to erect a monument over the remains of Roger B. Taney, late Chief Judge of the Supreme Court of the United States.

Also, the Senate bill entitled, an Act to repeal sections 87, 88, and 89 of Article 14 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Kent county, title "drovers."

Also, the Senate bill entitled, an Act to authorize the County Commissioner of Kent county, to convey to John Haddaway and others of said county, a portion of a landing on Chester river in Quaker Neck;

Which were severally read a second time.

Mr. Calvert, from Select Committee, reported favorably without amendment the Senate bill entitled, an Act requiring the County Commissioners of Prince George's county to construct a bridge across the Eastern Branch at Bladensburg on the turnpike leading to Washington, and authorizing them to levy a sum therefor;

Which was read a second time.

Mr. Brydon, from Select Committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 23 of the 1st Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Allegany county, as amended and re-enacted by the Act of 1864, chapter 121, section 1, and to amend and re-enact the said section.

Mr. Aydelott, from Select Committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to confirm the title of Worcester county, to the public road, leading from the village of Sandy Hill, to Parker's Bay in said county, and the wharf at said bay.

Mr. McCulloh, from Select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to authorize the Mayor and Councilmen of the city of Cumberland, to establish and enforce an inspection and measurement of gas and gasometres in the city of Cumberland;

Which were severally read a first time.

Mr. Dawson, from Committee on Registration, reported favorably with proposed amendments, the bill entitled, an Act to repeal the Act of 1865, chapter 174, entitled, an Act relating to the registration of the voters of the State, and to
