Mr. Evans presented the petition of Thomas P. Jones, and others of Cecil county, against any alteration of the Sabbath Law;

Which was read and referred to Select Committee on Sunday Law.

Mr. Shipley presented a petition of 150 citizens of Baltimore and Carroll counties, praying for an Act authorizing the Commissioners of said counties, to build a bridge over the Patapsco Falls, where the Lime Kiln road crosses said falls.

Which was read and referred to the Baltimore and Carroll county delegations.
