AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Section 1, line 4, strike out all after the word to, and insert "Pay out of general levy of said county to the Crier of the Circuit Court four dollars per day for each day said Court is in session, and said Crier in attendance upon said Court, which per diem shall be in lieu of all other compensation.
