On motion of Mr. Davis, of Charles,

The House took up for consideration,

The bill entitled, an Act to repeal sections 1 and 3 of sub-section 4 of chapter 160 of the Act of January session, 1865, providing for a uniform system of Free Public Schools for the State of Maryland and re-enact the same with amendment;

Said bill being upon its second reading,

Mr. Davis, proposed the following amendment :

Amend sub-section 1, in line 13, strike out "three" and insert "two;"

Which was adopted.

Amend section 3, in line 10, strike out the words "and fifty;"

Which was adopted ;

The bill was then referred to the Committee on Education.
