

Reported it without amendment,

The bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Maddox, from the Select Committee reported a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 3 of an Act passed at January session, 1866, chapter 108, entitled, an Act to amend an Act entitled, an act to aid and encourage enlistments into the Maryland regiments in service of the United States, passed e864, chapter 15, and re-enact the same with amendments;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance;
