Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to authorize and direct the Comptroller to adjust and settle the claims of the Grain Inspectors, at Baltimore city.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills;

A bill entitled, an Act to change the name of John Wesley Pitcock to John Wesley Baker;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Also, bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Chester River Steam Boat Company;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

On motion of Mr. Stephenson,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Stephenson, Kimmel and Tome, to report a bill for the protection of Fish and Wild Fowl in Romney Creek, in Harford county.

On motion of Mr. Bowie, it was

Ordered, That when any Senator shall ask leave to report a bill to repeal, alter or amend any existing Act he shall in the motion for leave, specify the title of the Act sought to be repealed, altered or amended.
