Which were severally read a second time.

Mr. Nelson, from Select Company, reported without amendment, Senate bill entitled, an Act to prohibit the granting of license for the sale of spiritous or fermented liquors or lager beer at or near Fallston, in Harford county, in the State of Maryland,

Which was read a second time.

The joint resolutions authorizing the Treasurer to issue the bonds of the State to any person who desires to receive them in payment of warrants of the Comptroller,

Being on their second reading,

On motion of Mr. Stevens,

Were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The House took up for consideration the bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 17 of Article 53 of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "Landlord and Tenant," and to reenact the same, with amendments,

Which was read a second time, and by special order a third time,
