Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

The rules were suspended, and

The Senate took up for consideration, the bill entitled, an Act supplementary to the Act of 1866, chapter 24, entitled, an act to authorize the Commissioners of Town of Havre de Grace, to sell certain lots in said town;

Mr. Tome submitted the following amendment:

Section 2, line 5, strike out "15," and insert "6 per cent. interest and 5 per cent. commissions;

In line 152, after the word "child," insert "or if any white man shall get any negro or mulatto woman with child;"

Mr. Bowie submitted the following amendment:

Strike out "negro or mulatto" in the first line, and "white," in the third line of the amendment.

On the question being put, it was Determined in the negative.
