RESOLUTION :

WHEREAS, There are in the Columbia Institute for the Education of Deaf and Dumb Persons, located in Washington city, D. C., certain pupils, named respectively Mary Jane, David, Malinda, Sarah B. and Lucretia Blair, all of the State of Maryland ;

AND WHEREAS, The present laws of Maryland do not direct or authorize any part of the appropriation made by the State for the benefit of Maryland pupils in that Institute to be expended for clothing for any of said pupils ;
