> BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, March 21st, 1867.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

A committee of this House having investigated the condition of the boundary line on the Eastern Shore of the Chesapeake Bay, between the States of Virginia and Maryland, find it unsettled and unmarked for several miles at the east and west termini of said line. We have received information that the Legislature of Virginia has appointed a Joint Committee of their two Houses, to meet a similar committee from the Legislature of Maryland, to settle and adjust the said boundary line, their work to be submitted to the Legislatures of the said States, respectively, for approval or rejection, and we have adopted the recommendation of the committee of this House, to appoint two members of this House and one of the Senate, to meet the Virginia Committee, for the purposes aforesaid, and we have appointed Messrs. Isaac D. Jones and William J. Aydelott on the part of this House, and request your Honorable Body to name a member of your body on said committee.
