After the word "Blunt," 2nd line, 1st section, strike out all said section to the end of the 8th line and insert, "and the heirs of Lemuel Offutt, shall be and are hereby invested with full power to construct a Rail Road beginning at the said Waltersville Granite Quarries, and running thence with the bed of the old Rail Road, known by the name of the Putney and Riddle Rail Road to intersect the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road at Putney and Riddle's switch;
