"Ordered, That the Comptroller of the Treasury report to this House without delay by what authority he has refused to acknowledge the validity of the action of this House in fixing the compensation of its Speaker, and why he has refused to honor the certificates of the Chairman of the Committee on Claims;" to which I reply, that no knowledge of the action of your honorable body in fixing the salary of the Speaker has reached me, nor have I refused at any time to honor the certificates of the Chairman of the Committee on Claims.

In this connection I would further represent that the payment of any part of the salary or per diem of members and officers is one of courtesy extended by the banks of this city at the present and former sessions of the General Assembly, and that no demand can be made by them until the appropriation bill by which they are paid is engrossed, signed

and promulgated.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
