Resolved, That ten thousand copies of a work, prepared by Dr. James Higgins, entitled, An Exposition of the Agricultural Advantages and Natural Resources of Maryland, be printed in pamphlet form, and held subject to the tuture action of this General Assembly, 500 copies for the use of the Senate.

Mr. Vickers, Chairman of the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, stated that he had been instructed by the majority of the Committee, to report unfavorably on the House Resolutions in relation to the power of the Legislature, to alter and amend the organic law of the State.
