Which was read and adopted.

The bill was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, and

Was accordingly engrossed.

Mr. Stirling moved a call of the Senate.

The Sergeant-at-Arms was sent to inform the absent Senators that their attendance was required in the Senate chamber.

On motion by Mr. Vickers,

All further proceedings under the call were dispensed with.

Mr. Bowie, by general consent, submitted the following:

Ordered, That the bill to regulate the sale of agricultural products, be printed.

On motion by Mr. Compton,

The rules were suspended, and

The bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the President and Directors of the Chesapeake Mutual Insurance Company of Baltimore, Maryland,

Was read the third time by special order, three-fourths concurring, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
