The President laid before the Senate the petition of Thomas R. Mathews, and other citizens of Baltimore county, praying the re-appointment of Charles Perego as Justice of the Peace for said county;

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Executive Nominations.

Mr. Bowie presented the petition of J. Dyer, & Co., of Baltimore city, to be refunded money illegally paid into the State Treasury on account of the storage of tobacco;

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Mr. Frazier presented the petition of the working men of the factories of Woodbury, Clipper, Mount Washington, Park Mill, and Mount Vernon, asking the General Assembly to enact a Law, making ten hours a legal day's work;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Mr. Holton presented the petition of 64 citizens of Howard county, asking protection for the tobacco growing interests of Howard, Carroll and Frederick counties, and praying the appointment of an Inspector for the same;

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Executive Nominations.

Mr. Stephenson presented the memorial of 18 citizens of Harford county in favor of granting a private road to William S. Bowman of said county;

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
