The December Term of 1865, being only about half through at the date from which this enquiry is contemplated, and again, the December Term, 1866, being about half through or eighteen days of the term held when the date of the enquiry ceases, so that although the report has the appearance of five terms, when they are really only three full terms and two parts of terms.
