Mr. Vickers, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported with an amendment a bill entitled, an Act to confirm the proceedings of the Commissioners appointed by Worcester County Court to divide the real estate of Wheatley Dennis, late of Worcester county, deceased;

Amendment adopted, bill read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Stirling moved a call of the Senate.

The Sergeant-at-Arms returned and stated that he had notified the absent Senators.

Mr. Stephenson, from the Select Committee, reported a bill entitled, an Act to protect Fish and Wild Fowl, in the waters of Romney Creek, in Harford county;

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Ohr,

The Senate took a recess for three-quarters of an hour.

At 2 o'clock P. M., the Senate convened.

On motion of Mr. Mules,

The Senate adjourned until Monday at 12 o'clock, M.
