Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an Act to add additional sections to the thirtieth article of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Crimes and Punishments, providing for the punishment of certain offences relating to public offices;

The bill entitled an act to amend and re-enact section 22d of an act to repeal article seventy-one of the code of Public General Laws entitled, "Oysters" regulating the taking and catching Oysters within this State and to re-enact the same with amendments thereto;

Was, on motion of Mr. Mackall, referred to the Committee on the Chesapeake and its tributaries.

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
