

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT to repeal the seventy-fourth section of the thirty-fifth Article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the Election of United States Senator, by inserting in third line after the words "Senator" the following words, And to enact another provision in lieu thereof." Passed Jan. 24, 1867.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the seventy-fourth section of the thirty-fifth Article of the Code of Public General Laws, be and the same is hereby repealed. Section repealed.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That in the first Election of Senator to represent this State in the Senate of the United States, which shall be held after the first day of April, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, the person elected shall be an inhabitant of the Eastern Shore of this State, and one of the Senators to be thereafter elected, shall always be an inhabitant of the Eastern Shore, and the other of the Western Shore of this State. U. S. Senators—where to be inhabitants.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT entitled, an Act to change the name of John Wesley Pitcock to John Wesley Baker. Passed Jan. 11, 1867.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the name of John Wesley Pitcock of Baltimore city, be and the same is hereby changed to John Wesley Baker. Name changed.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.
