

of any funds not otherwise appropriated in such proportion as they may respectively appear by the certificate of the Collector of Baltimore city to be entitled to the same, a sum of money equal to the amount of taxes paid by them in error into the City Treasury on an excess of forty-eight thousand two hundred dollars over assessment of the premises known as the Gilmore House of Baltimore city, from the year eighteen hundred and fifty-eight to the present time, and interest thereon from the date of the respective payments of such excess.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, be and he is hereby required on the warrant of the Comptroller to pay to William Gilmore and Robert Gilmore, Junior, in the proportion shewn to be due them respectively a sum of money equal to the amount by them paid, and received into the State Treasury in error on an excess of forty-eight thousand two hundred dollars, over-assessment of said premises in the preceding Section named, since the year eighteen hundred and fifty-eight.

Treasurer authorized to pay upon warrant.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this Act have full force and effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 21.

AN ACT entitled, "an Act to secure the completion of the Wicomico and Pocomoke Railroad." Passed Jan. 31, 1867.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the lien held by the State of Maryland, on the property of the Wicomico and Pocomoke Railroad Company, to secure the payment of six per centum interest out of the profits of the work on the shares of the capital stock of the said Company, held by the State, shall not be construed to give a preference to the said State over the bond holders of the said Company, and the said Lien of the State waived.
