Reported it without amendment.

The bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Earle, from the Committee on Finance to which was referred the bill entitled, an Act to repeal section three of an Act passed at January session, 1866, chapter 108, entitled, an Act to amend an Act entitled, an Act to aid and encourage enlistments into the Maryland regiments in the service of the United States, passed 1864, chapter 15, and re-enact the same with amendments;

Reported it without amendment,

The bill was then read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Earle, from the Committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, an Act to compensate Frances A. Prevost for services rendered as Assistant Clerk in the office of the clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city, under Edward Dowling, late clerk thereof;

Reported it without amendment,
