

drawing the same; for every cart or wagon, the breadth of whose wheels shall be more than ten inches and not exceeding twelve inches or being ten inches shall roll more than fifteen inches, three cents for every horse drawing the same; for every cart or wagon, the breadth of whose wheels shall be more than twelve inches, two cents for every horse drawing the same.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT to incorporate the Principio Manufacturing company. Passed Mar. 1, 1867.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That George P. Whitaker, Joseph Couden, E. S. Whitaker, Levi H. Evans, Nelson Whitaker, Henry S. Couden and Henry C. Whitaker, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they are hereby created a body corporate by the name and style of the Principio Manufacturing Company, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be capable in law to purchase, hold and dispose of property, real personal and mixed, fee-simple or leasehold, to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, and answer and defend, and be answered and defended, in any Court of Law or Equity and in any other place whatsoever, to receive and make deeds and contracts, to make, have and use a common seal, and renew, alter and change the same at pleasure, to ordain and establish such by-laws, ordinances and regulations as may appear necessary for regulating the concerns of said corporation, not being contrary to this Act or to the Constitution and laws of the State or of the United States, and to do all such acts and things as shall be necessary and proper for the manufacture of pig, bloom, bar, plate or sheet iron, nails, spikes and all other articles made thereof, in whole or in part, and to mine and dig ore and coal in the State of Mary- Incorporated —power and privileges.
