Attorneys and Practitioners at Law required to take oath.

Sec. 10. *And be it enacted*, That every Attorney or other practitioner at law shall in open Court take and subscribe the following oath or affirmation, I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will at all times demean myself fairly and honorably as an Attorney and Practitioner at Law, that I will bear true allegiance to the State of Maryland, and support the laws and Constitution thereof, and that I will bear true allegiance to the United States, and that I will support, protect and defend the Constitution, Laws and Government thereof as the Supreme Law of the Land; any law or ordinance of this or any State to the contrary notwithstanding.

Sec. —. *And be it enacted*, That this Law shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.
