Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That said Bonds shall be redeemable in six years from this date.

Tax to be levied.

And be it enacted, That for the payment of the interest and the redemption of the principal of the said Bonds, when due, there shall be levied upon the assessable property of the State, a tax of one cent in the one hundred dollars, to be collected as other taxes are now collected, and the proceeds of said tax shall be paid to the Treasurer of the State and be by him set apart for the payment of the interest and for the redemption of the principal of said Bonds, and he shall invest the surplus of receipts from the said tax after paying interest, as a sinking fund for the redemption of said Bonds.
