

lector by them appointed, and the said collector shall have power to distrain therefor as the collectors of county taxes, and the Commissioners shall fix the term of office, responsibility and compensation of said collector.

Sec. 13. *And be it enacted*, That the President of the Commissioners shall be Treasurer of the corporation, and shall give bond to the Commissioners with security to be approved by them in such penalty as they shall prescribe, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duty as Treasurer, and shall receive and pay away monies according to the ordinances of the Commissioners, or a majority of them, and shall report to them at least every three months what disposition he has made of the same.

Treasurer required to give bond.

Sec 14. *And be it enacted*, That the President shall have all the powers of a Justice of the Peace in criminal cases when the Commissioners are a party, and shall receive the same fees as a Justice of the Peace is allowed for similar cases, and an appeal from his judgment, where the demand exceeds five dollars, may be taken to the Circuit Court for the county, which shall hear and determine the matter as upon appeals from a Justice of the Peace.

President to have all the powers of a Justice of the Peace.

Sec. 15. *And be it enacted*, That all officers elected under this charter shall, before they enter upon the duties of their office, take an oath that they will diligently and faithfully, to the best of their judgement, discharge the duties of their office without favor, partiality or prejudice, and shall file the certificate of the officer before whom the same was taken among the records of the corporation.

Required to take an oath.

Sec. 16. *And be it enacted*, That all officers elected under this charter shall continue to act until other officers have been elected and qualified in their places.

To continue in office until others are elected and qualified.

Sec. 17. *And be it enacted*, That all fines and forfeitures imposed under the ordinances of this corporation, shall be recoverable before the President or a Justice of the Peace, similar to the mode of collecting small debts.
