Mr. Waters submitted the following:

Amend by adding the following as an additional section to come in as section fifteen.

Section 15. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall not apply to Calvert, Dorchester, Allegany, Worcester, Kent, Charles, Anne Arundel, Somerset, Washington, Talbot and St. Mary's counties, and Baltimore city.

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Tome submitted the following amendment:

Add after section 15. *Be it enacted*, That all such laws in the several counties relating to this section is hereby repealed.

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Young submitted the following amendment

Section 16. That any person, unlawfully or wilfully taking and carrying away any dog upon which tax has been paid, shall be considered guilty of a misdemeanor upon information made to a justice of the peace, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$25. The party so fined shall give security for fine and costs, or be confined in the county jail until such fine and costs and jail fees shall have been paid.

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Philpot submitted the following amendment:
