A bill entitled, an Act to amend an Act to add additional sections to Article first of the Code of Public Local Laws of Allegany county, relating to the business of the Circuit Courts, and the summoning of Jurors in said county, passed at January Session, 1866, of the General Assembly of Maryland, chapter 138, and re-enact the same as amended ;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
