

and made capable to hold and enjoy the said parcel of ground and premises mentioned, to be conveyed by said deed for her own use and benefit in fee simple, according to the tenor thereof, in the same manner and as perfectly to all intents and purposes and with the same powers of disposition as if she had been a citizen of this State and of the United States at the time of the execution of said deed.

CHAPTER 230.

Passed Mar. 9, 1867. AN ACT entitled, a supplement to the Act passed by the General Assembly of Maryland, at January Session, eighteen hundred and sixty, entitled, an Act to incorporate a Company to build a Turnpike road from Libertytown, in Frederick county, to intersect the Woodsboro' and Frederick Turnpike road, at or near the Monocacy Bridge.

Subscription for stock. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a subscription book shall be opened at Mount Pleasant, under the direction of Ezra Houck, Samuel Huke, John P. Derr, E. A. Shriver, Jacob Diller, Jeremiah H. Gramer, D. C. Johnson, John W. Ogborn, Fairfax Schley, Ezra Brongle and Charles A. Thomas, for a capital stock of ten thousand dollars, in shares of twenty dollars each, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for that purpose, who shall proceed in the manner directed in the second section of said Act.
